Golden Guidelines

Wild Riders connections begin with shared passion and common values.

The most meaningful part of this life's journey is connection. Traveling together bonds in such a special way - with horses, with nature and with each other - that multiplies the beauty of it.

If you want to be part of our community, you must follow our code of conduct:

1. **No horse. No journey. Cherish horses.** It is essential to care for the well-being of the horses, of nature, and of each other.
2. **Courage and Character.** Our community is built on meaningful bonding with those who live by values.
3. **Connections are key.** Relationships matter and we access special connections.
4. **Wilderness with style.** The equestrian path is as raw as selective, it requires the willingness to adapt and embrace surprises.
5. **Seasoned riders only.** You need to be ready to endure the elements with certain grace. Storms will come. Stay steady. Stay sharp.
6. **It can get muddy.** Boots are just stuff and this life is not always clean — deal with it.
7. **Keep it cool.** If you want to make it, a sense of humor is a complement as essential as the blood in your veins.
8. **Club rides.** To be a WR member, ride with us once a year - or more! Membership is earned through shared experience, that's how we bond and keep the connection to the community alive.
9. **Only the *senzy*.** Bring people who belong, we grow through recommendation and welcome riders who share our values and style.
10. **Respect.**
We do not tolerate disrespect, discrimination, or hate of any kind. Non-negotiable. No exceptions.

Equestrian Etiquette

For safety reasons, equestrian equipment and good manners are required.

1. Dress code

The use of a certified riding helmet is strictly compulsory at all times while around horses. You must bring your own. For maximum protection, all riders must wear appropriate riding equipment and clothing.

2. Mindful riding

You must pay constant attention to horse behavior, trail conditions, the natural environment and the rest of the group, maintaining safety measures at all times.

3. Lead rules

In the group's best interest and welfare, riders must strictly follow the guide's instructions, doing as told promptly is mandatory.

Horses can be unpredictable and accidents can happen. If safety precautions and common sense are used then some can be prevented. Everyone must go through the safety reminders of best practice around horses, including those who have been riding for many years.

Confidentiality Awareness

Wild Riders' is committed to nature care and responsible travel. It is a shared responsibility to preserve destinations and experiences. We ask for your help in keeping it special and authentic. Please note the confidential character of WR's community.

- We ask for discretion with detailed data and encourage good practices, such as respecting the privacy of fellow riders and professionals. This includes keeping names, contact details, specific routes and destinations strictly confidential.
- It is explicitly prohibited to record GPS tracks or any digital logs of the route. It is strictly forbidden to share any other trip details or coordinates on the internet or in any social media or app.
